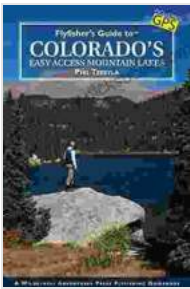

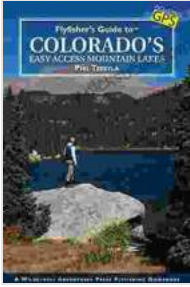

fishing for a variety of fish species. So get out there and start exploring!

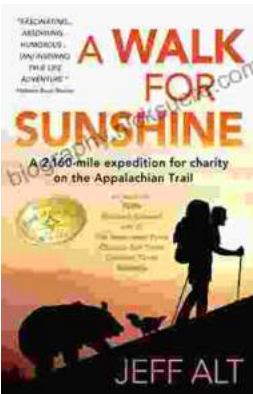

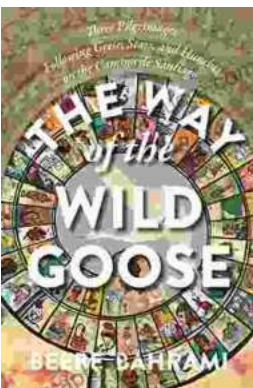
