- The right to participate in tribal ceremonies and events.

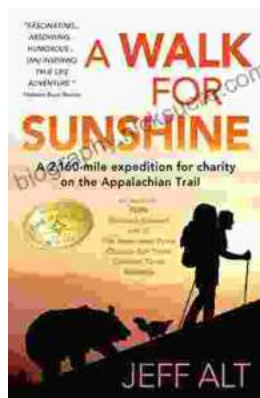

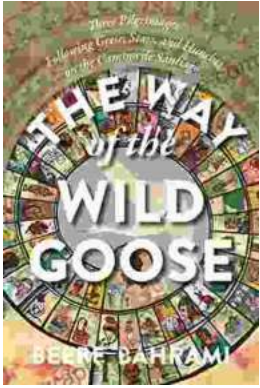
