



- December: Christmas is celebrated on December 25th. This day is dedicated to the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.



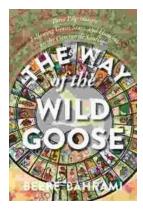
